#### Paris

Named for both the cast-iron Staub pots that top the entry's shelves and the à la carte dishes served in those casseroles. Les Cocottes is famed chef Christian Constant's fourth restaurant. Parisians are queuing up for the well-priced, homey fare like cod roasted with white beans and chorizo (\$22) and the justifiably titled "fabuleuse" chocolate tart (\$12). A cubby-indented counter runs the length of this 21st-century diner. Go early, as there are no reservations (135 rue Saint-Dominique; 33 1 45 50 10 31).

At first glance it looks like any other stylish boutique property. But it's what you can't see that makes it different. Proximity is striving for LEED Platinum status, which would make it America's greenest (indoor) spot to spend the night. More than 70 sustainable
